

Call for Ceramic Artists

Deadline to Apply: **Sunday, October 12, 2025, 11:59pm PST**Applications will be accepted via Slideroom only

EXHIBITION OVERVIEW

The American Museum of Ceramic Art (AMOCA) is proud to announce *Fractured Foundations: 250 Years of American History.* We invite ceramic artists to participate in this exhibition by proposing recently created or new work in response to the exhibition's prompt.

Artists are invited to propose work that reflects on an event in US History that demonstrates resilience, injustice, triumph, and the impact of federal, state, and local policies. For examples of historical events, <u>view the google spreadsheet</u>. Artists can choose an event from this list or select their own.

This exhibition aims to challenge traditional historical narratives and offer a more accurate perspective on our country. Applications for *Fractured Foundations* are open through October 12, 2025; the exhibition will run from June 27 to November 29, 2026.

Artists whose work is selected for the exhibition will be celebrated at the opening reception on June 27, 2026. The exhibition will provide an invaluable platform for showcasing a diverse and thought-provoking range of new work and foster recognition within the ceramics community.

Eligibility and Guidelines

ELIGIBILITY:

- Open to artists aged 18 or older residing in the United States
- Artwork must consist of at least 50% clay
- Artwork must be about a historical event in America's history; artists may choose an
 event from the google spreadsheet provided or select their own
- Work proposed for the exhibition must be currently in progress or have been created within the last 3 years

GUIDELINES for ACCEPTED ARTISTS:

- For shipped work, box dimensions must not exceed 24" in any direction
- For hand-delivered work, artwork dimensions must not exceed 48" in any direction
- Artwork should be exhibition-ready, with the artist responsible for providing any necessary mounting fixtures. AMOCA will provide pedestals
- AMOCA reserves the right to decline any artwork that arrives damaged or does not match the application submission

Application Information & Materials

APPLICATION INFORMATION

- Proposals must include an accompanying project statement describing how your proposed piece responds to the exhibition theme
- To propose a recently completed piece, submit 3-4 images
- To propose a new (not yet completed) work, please submit a sketch and/or detailed written description of the proposed work along with 3 images of previously completed, existing work for reference

REQUESTED MATERIALS

- Project Statement: Please provide 250 words (maximum) describing your proposed project and how it best responds to the exhibition theme.
- Images:
 - Completed work: submit 3–4 images
 - Proposed new work: submit sketches and/or description + 3 images of past work for reference

FEE

• There is a \$10 application fee, which helps to defray the costs of using SlideRoom

Transportation and Shipping

SHIPPING EXPENSES

Selected artists are responsible for shipping/insurance fees to AMOCA.

AMOCA will pay for return shipping costs (up to \$100) and insurance (covered up to \$1,500). Artists are responsible for informing AMOCA of any changes to the return address provided in the application. Failure to do so may result in the artwork being returned to the wrong address or to AMOCA, in which case, the artist will be responsible for the cost of reshipping the work.

Drop Off & Pick Up

Local artists may drop off and pick up the artwork in person at AMOCA during designated hours. Any work dropped off must be picked up. Any work not picked up by March 1, 2027, will become the property of AMOCA unless otherwise agreed to with the Exhibition Manager.

HOW TO APPLY

Application Platform

Application deadline October 12, 2025

Instructions:

- 1. Locate the <u>Application</u> on Slideroom
- 2. You'll be prompted to create an account
- 3. Upload the requested materials
- 4. Pay the \$10 application fee
- 5. Click Submit

Submission Materials:

 Project Statement: Describe your proposed project and how it responds to the exhibition theme (250 words maximum)

- Short Artist Bio: provide 250 (maximum) words telling us briefly about yourself and your ceramic background.
- Images & Image descriptions:
 - If proposing a completed work (created 2023 or after), upload 3–4 images of that piece
 - If proposing a new work, upload a sketch and/or description of your proposed new piece (you may upload a multi-page pdf if necessary) + 3 images of past work for reference
 - Save images using the following format: Last Name First Name_Title.jpg
 Example; AliagaPam_UFW90s.jpg
 - Add Title, Materials, Year Completed, and Dimensions (height, width, and depth - Ex: 12x24x8 inches or 12"x24"x8") for each image
- Additional Detail: Use the optional Additional Details category to provide any additional information

FAQ

Q: I created a piece about the Tulsa Race Massacre in 2020. Can I send you pictures of that completed clay piece for consideration for *Fractured Foundations*?

A: No. This call is for recently created or new work only. We're looking for work created in 2023 or after. If you have an idea for a piece but haven't yet created it, submit a sketch of your new idea.

Q: I've started my piece, but it's not finished yet. Should I upload a picture of the work in progress?

A: Sure! We're happy to see images that will give us a better understanding of what you propose. Please upload a picture of your work in progress as one of your attachments.

Q: How will my submission be evaluated?

A: Applications will be reviewed by a Guest Juror (TBD), based on concept and execution of previous work.

Q: When will I hear back?

A: Participants will be notified by November 14, 2025.

Q: How long do I have to create the new work I proposed?

A: Accepted artists will be notified by Friday, November 14, 2025. Artwork needs to be completed and delivered to AMOCA in early May 2026.
