Exhibition Summary:

Home Sweet Home is a solo exhibition by Carly Slade, winner of "Best of Show" in AMOCA's Fahrenheit 2024 juried exhibition. Home Sweet Home will feature new works influenced by Slade's blue-collar roots and concern for the precarious nature of the working class.

The exhibition will be on view in the Igal & Diane Silber Vault Gallery at AMOCA, June-October, 2026.

About the Artist:

Carly Slade grew up in "big sky" Alberta, Canada where she spent her early working life in the trades, from carpentry to concrete. She is most at home in a shop. Using a mix of materials (most often including clay, embroidery, and building supplies), Slade creates dioramas of real places in an unreal perspective. She received her MFA from San Jose State University and her BFA from the Alberta University of the Arts. Slade is currently an Assistant Professor in Ceramics at the Nova Scotia College of Art and Design in Halifax, NS, Canada.
