## **Exhibition Summary:**

**Fractured Foundations: 250 Years of American History** commemorates the United States of America's semiquincentennial by featuring recent and new work by accomplished ceramic artists responding to lesser-known historical events that demonstrate the resilience of an individual or a community impacted by injustice from federal, state, or local policies.

The exhibition features both a curated component and a call for work. AMOCA has invited acclaimed ceramic artists whose work explores issues that are reflected in the theme of this exhibition, including Natalia Arbelaez, Chotsani Elaine Dean, Morel Doucet, Salvador Jiménez-Flores, Akinsanya Kambon, Cathy Lu, Vick Quezada, Jos Sances, Kukuli Velarde, and Patti Warashina. Artists have been asked to select an underrepresented event in America's history to reconsider through the lens of contemporary art. Examples of possible topics include the Eugenics Records Office, the Mississippi Appendectomy sterilization efforts, and the 2014-2019 Flint Water Crisis.

AMOCA has also issued an open call for ceramic work, inviting artists to propose their own project for the exhibition. The dual-component exhibition model ensures more equitable representation, reflecting the exhibition's goal to highlight people and topics that have previously been marginalized. An accompanying catalog will document the artistic interpretations and historical narratives presented in the exhibition, leaving a lasting scholarly legacy for the artists. This exhibition will be on view at AMOCA from June 27 through November 29, 2026.
